Course Description for NCFE CACHE Level 3 Technical Diploma in Health and Social Care

Description

To provide learners with an in-depth knowledge of core subject areas in health and social care to support progression into Higher Education, the workplace or further learning in related subject areas at Level 4 and above.

Assessment

Learners must achieve a pass grade in all assessments which include 14 Mandatory units and 3 optional units which are internally assessed. There are also 3 External assessments (exams) which are externally set and externally marked. Learners will be graded A*-D for each assessment.

There is a maximum of two opportunities for learners to attempt each external assessment in order to achieve a pass grade or improve a grade.

The first exam will take place in the first year of the course and the second and third exam will take place in the second year of the course.

Out of class learning including home-learning

Learners will be expected to complete 175 hours of work experience in a care setting

Learners will be expected to complete homework on a weekly basis which will consist of research, reading or written tasks.

Students can also complete coursework/homework at the coursework catch-up club on Tuesday's 3pm-4pm.

How parents can help

Parents/carers can ensure their child comes equipped to class.

Parents/carers can support students by checking and signing planners every week to check that homework has been completed.

Parents/carers can also encourage students to attend coursework catch-up classes to get extra support with their coursework/homework.
