Description Edexcel GCSE Psychology 1-9 1PS0 Assessment Paper 1 1 hour and 45 minutes written paper 55% of the qualification 98 marks Six sections Five of the six sections include multiple choice and open answer questions on the topics above The last section includes 2 extended answer questions focussing in debates within psychology Paper 2 1 hour 20 minutes written paper 45% of the qualification 79 marks Section A: research methods Section B optional topics: Criminal psychology and Sleep and dreaming. Out of class learning including home-learning Students will have regular exam questions to complete at home

In addition to this all past papers are accessible on the Edexcel website and students will be expected to revise. Students also have a revision guide which they will expected to use to revise for internal practice tests and assessments

How parents can help
