## **Course Description for NCFE CACHE Level 2 Award in Child Development and Care**

#### Description

This qualification provides the opportunity to gain a vocational qualification that gives a basic introduction into the Childcare sector. It has been designed to meet the needs of learners from the age of 14 years. It includes the knowledge and understanding of child development and well-being necessary for working with children in a variety of settings. It is aimed at a range of learners who wish to be introduced to childcare and development of children aged 0-5 years. It also gives learners an insight into their preferred learning styles and assists in developing their ability to study.

### Assessment

This qualification consists of 3 units: two graded A\*- D assessed by a graded assessment task; and a synoptic assessment unit which is assessed via a Multiple choice paper.
